She has taught both undergraduate (Economics) and post-graduate (MBA & MPhil) students at renowned, and previously marginalised academic institutions. She has also offered guest lectures on Development Studies at universities in Europe (Vrije University & Vlerick Business School Amsterdam) and in the United Stated of America (Juniata College, Kansas University, University of Massachusetts). Her research field is development economics focusing on finance; behavioural economics; gender and welfare. She has experience with randomized control trials (RCTs), field experiments, household surveys and micro-data, and general equilibrium models. She is a researcher and trainer with the African Economic Research Consortium, a renown think-tank in Africa. Elizabeth also has substantial experience with the policy making process in emerging and developing economies. She spent time at the World Bank Office of the Chief Economist for Africa region in Washington, DC. and has consulted for the African Development Bank, United Nations, the GIZ, IDRC, as well as national government departments. She enjoys the intersectionality of academia and practice, i.e., converting research into policy. Prior to her academic role, she was the Chief Executive Officer of the South African Savings Institute, under the Ministry of Finance in South Africa and the Industrial Development Corporation. She holds a PhD in Economics from the University of Cape Town, an MA in Economic Policy and Planning and a BA (Hons) in Economics and Political Science from Makerere University in Uganda.

He previously worked with Makerere University as a Senior Lecturer and Head of Department of Economic Theory and Analysis. He has been a visiting Lecturer in Monetary Theory and Practice and Econometrics at the African Economic Research Consortium (AERC) Collaborative Masters Joint Facility for Electives Programme and Monetary Economics for AERC Collaborative PhD programme. He is a Faculty Member at the Trade Policy Training Centre in Africa (TRAPCA), under the Eastern and Southern African Management Institute (ESAMI) Arusha, Tanzania. He also worked with World Bank between 2004 – 2007 as a Consultant Economist on Labour Market and Structural change in Uganda; Labour and growth in the Ugandan informal sector; Fiscal deficits and Debt Sustainability; Aid Management in Uganda; and other Macro issues. Chairman, National Core Team for the preparation of the Interim Poverty Reduction Strategy Paper (I-PRSP) (2002) and Chairman, Economic Policy Working Group of the Agricultural Transformation Agenda, Federal Ministry of Agriculture Nigeria (2014). He served on National Working Committee for the Preparation of Nigeria's Vision 2010, 2020 and Nigeria's Agenda 2050. Olu Ajakaiye also was a member of the team that prepared the Economic Recovery of Growth Plan, 2017-2020 and National Development Plan of Nigeria, 2021-2025. He also served on the Advisory Panel of the UN African HDR, 2011, Advisory Committee of WTO Chairs Programme, Advisory Board, UNHDR, New York; 2016, 2019 -2022; Commissioning Panel, DFID/Economic and Social Research Council, London, 2015 - 2016, among others.
