Strategic Plan and Policy Challenges for Africa: A Roadmap to 2025-2035

This session will begin with a brief presentation of the strategic plan of the AERC for the 2025-2035 period, outlining our vision and objectives for the future. We will highlight the key areas of focus, including how we aim to address current capacity and policy challenges and build on past achievements to drive sustainable economic development across Africa.

Following the strategic presentation, a policy panel will discuss the unprecedented changes Africa is facing today and the critical policy challenges that need to be addressed. The session will examine both short-term and long-term solutions to promote inclusive growth, address macroeconomic instability, manage recurring debt distress, mitigate unexpected fluctuations in development financing (e.g. current waves of cuts in humanitarian and development aid by major donors), and navigate changing geopolitical dynamics. Panellists will provide insights into how policies can be designed, implemented, and coordinated to effectively address these challenges and set Africa on a path to sustainable development.
